Friends,

Sometimes in my ministry some people have told me that they didn't understand the amount of time we spend in worship on the scriptures of the Bible. They asked why we read the scriptures, only to have me repeat the scriptures during the sermon. Why do I often cross-reference the Bible, introducing even MORE scriptures during the sermon? Why do the words of our liturgy, our hymns and our prayers during worship all need to reflect those scriptures?

Well, the first, most obvious answer is that it's my job. A big part of my calling as a pastor is the reading and interpretation of the word of God that we find in the Bible. With this in mind, I try to arrange worship services around the scriptures we read; the scriptures I base my sermons on. Everything we do in worship, from the hymns to the children's message to the benediction, should all reinforce the message of those scriptures and how we can live that message in our lives.

All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness...

2 Timothy 3:16

Another reason that scripture is central to our services is that otherwise, I'm not a pastor. I could stand in front of the congregation and spout off what I think is wise or inspirational or just good advice. That would only make me a motivational speaker. But I'm all too aware of how insufficient my own wisdom can be. If my sermons, and every other element of our worship services, are to be the blessing that God promises they can be, they cannot rely on my own wisdom or righteousness. Our worship must be based on words that are wiser and truer than anything I have to offer. Everything we do in worship has to be founded not on my words, but on the word of God.

We also constantly give thanks to God for this, that when you received the word of God that you heard from us, you accepted it not as a human word but as what it really is, God's word, which is also at work in you believers.

1 Thessalonians 2:13

So when we worship together, please think about the scriptures we read and emphasize in every element of our worship. What message are these words trying to tell you, and how will that message influence your life? How is that message restated in the children's message and the verses of our hymns? And most of all, remember that these scriptures come from someone who is wiser and more righteous than any of us; who loves us and wants what's best for us. God's promise is that these words (not mine) are wise, righteous, and true, and that they will bless our lives forever.

The sum of your word is truth; and every one of your righteous ordinances endures forever.
