Friends,

The season of Lent, from Ash Wednesday to the Saturday before Easter, is traditionally a more solemn time in the church year. Churches usually take this time to meditate on our sin and our mortality. This is in order to help us understand our need for a Savior, one who offers us redemption from our sin and hope of eternal life.

Because of this somber attitude, there's a word that has become taboo during Lent. It is the English version of two Hebrew words. The first, "halelu" is a second person plural imperative verb, meaning "a command to a group to joyously sing praise." The second word, "Yah", is a shortened version of the name of God, "Yahweh". Brought together, the words form a command to a group of people to praise the Lord. It is also used simply as a one-word expression of praise to God.

Like many pastors and churches, I choose not to use this word during worship services until Easter morning. Due to this taboo, I technically shouldn't even write this word during Lent. Even if I could, it's not certain how it's even spelled. Sometimes it's an 8-letter word starting with "A". Other times it's a 10-letter word starting with "H", especially if you're a fan of Handel's "Messiah" or the modern singer/songwriter Leonard Cohen.

And the twenty-four elders and the four living creatures fell down and worshipped God who is seated on the throne, saying, 'Amen! H_____!' adapted from Revelation 19:4

I know it seems like I'm teasing you by talking so much about a word that I'm not writing. And I suppose that's part of the meaning of Lent. We spend these weeks in solemn mediation, confessing our shortcomings and reflecting on the end of our earthly lives. This all leads up to a week remembering all the terrible things that happened in the last days of Jesus' life. Betrayed and abandoned by His friends. Unjustly accused and beaten by religious leaders. Tortured and executed by the government. And yet we go through all this darkness knowing that the light and joy of Easter morning is ahead of us! When we will know that all of these trials and tribulations for Jesus, even his death, were only temporary! When we will proclaim that, in Jesus Christ our Savior, God's forgiveness and love for us are forever! And then, as we sing in celebration on Easter, we can finally shout out the word ...

... well, you know the word!

Then I heard what seemed to be the voice of a great multitude, like the sound of many waters and like the sound of mighty thunder-peals, crying out, 'H______! For the Lord our God the Almighty reigns!'

Endowment Fund

Market Update - 2023, 4th Quarter

In the last quarter of the year, the markets regained strength from earlier in 2023 as the S&P 500 finished the year up around 23%. In December, U.S. retail sales rose 0.6%, capping off a strong holiday season, which positively surprised economists.

The Federal Reserve is currently holding short-term interest rates steady. While it seems probable that the Fed concluded its interest rate hike cycle and baring some unforeseen event, our forecast does not anticipate a cut in the next couple meetings.

The First Presbyterian Church Agency finished the 2023 calendar year up 12.9%. The Agency has produced an annual rate of return of 5.5% since its inception. The overall mix of the endowment portfolio remains in-line with targets.

Both the 'soft landing' and 'recession' camps agree that economic growth will slow going forward as we enter a year filled with elections and geopolitical challenges. While it is hard to predict short term market movements, the portfolio will remain fully invested. This portfolio is set up to meet long-term return and risk objectives.

Estate Planning Tip

New Year's Estate Planning Resolutions

Beginning a new year allows for reflection of the year prior and setting resolutions for the year to come. Make your 2024 New Year's resolution a plan to prepare and protect your loved ones through estate planning. Although most know the importance of having a plan, studies suggest only 33% of Americans have a will or estate plan. The biggest hurdle, like most resolutions, is getting started. Below are the steps to creating a successful estate plan:

- 1. Gather personal information about you and your family such as birth dates, social security numbers and addresses.
- 2. Take inventory of your assets and liabilities and their values. Make note of the contact information for the company that holds them.
- 3. Consider important questions on what your plan might look like: Who will inherit your assets? Will you leave them to a person or a charity or a favorite charity/non-profit? If you become incapacitated, who will make financial and medical decisions on your behalf? If children are involved in your plan, who will you appoint as guardian if something were to happen to you or your significant other?
- 4. Gather any existing pertinent estate planning documents (will, trust document, power of attorney, etc).

Once you have accomplished the steps above, you are prepared for a conversation with your attorney to update or create an estate plan customized to fulfill your needs and wishes.


