Friends,

The apostle Paul spent years of his adult life founding churches all around the Mediterranean Sea. And he spent a lot of that time staying in touch with them by writing letters to them. Those letters make up a big part of the New Testament.

We'll spend our worship services during the "ordinary time" between Christmas and Lent studying those letters. We'll find out what Paul had to say to these new congregations, and why. Some of these letters could seem like dry theological lectures. But remember, these fledgling Christians were hearing the fundamentals of our faith for the first time! Other letters were marked by Paul's love for these churches and his passionate desire for their success.

Sometimes Paul was delighted by their progress. The communities of Christian love that they were creating gave him hope that this new faith could not only survive, but thrive!

First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith is proclaimed throughout the world ... I am longing to see you ... so that we may be mutually encouraged by each other's faith, both yours and mine. – from Romans 1:8-12

In other letters, Paul sounded like a congregation's disappointed father. After Paul left some churches, they had been visited by false apostles who had tried to corrupt the gospel of Jesus Christ into something different. Meanwhile, the congregation in Corinth had separated into cliques and factions. And their communion services had turned into drunken parties where some members went away hungry!

What! Do you not have homes to eat and drink in? Or do you show contempt for the church of God and humiliate those who have nothing? What should I say to you? Should I commend you? In this matter I do not commend you! – 1

Corinthians 11:22

And through it all, Paul was trying to unite congregations that already seemed hopelessly divided, by background, race, culture, and economic class. Some churches even had slaves and free people worshipping side by side!

We are separated from these churches by two thousand years and thousands of miles. But the words of Paul's letters have echoed throughout our history. Maybe we've experienced some of the problems that plagued these early congregations. But when we read Paul's letters, we can also learn from their trials. These letters help us understand what we believe as Christians. They guide us in our relationships, not only in our churches, but in our families and our workplaces. They speak to how we offer our talents and our money. But they also teach us how to live in peace with the Christians around us, knowing that, even when we disagree, we have still been brought together by God.

There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus. – Galatians 3:28
